



# Undergraduate Campaign for Renovation



To meet the requirements of Dartmouth's Fuller Audit, our society must update and improve our current physical plant in the immediate future, **or we will cease to exist as an organization.** We hope to raise these funds with the help of both our undergraduate members and alumni network in the coming months. As of now, we hope to raise about \$2.5 million to complete the capital campaign.

Our physical plant was constructed in 1923 and despite valiant efforts to maintain its

integrity, the house is in dire need of renovation.



So far the undergraduates have saved **\$35,000** in the past 3 years. Our goal is to reach **\$100,000** before September of 2008.

**We are asking you for donations of up to \$10,000**, as we continue our efforts of making donations tax deductible.

**Any donation to Kappa Kappa Kappa is independent of contributions you may choose to make to Dartmouth College and should not affect planned giving to the College.**

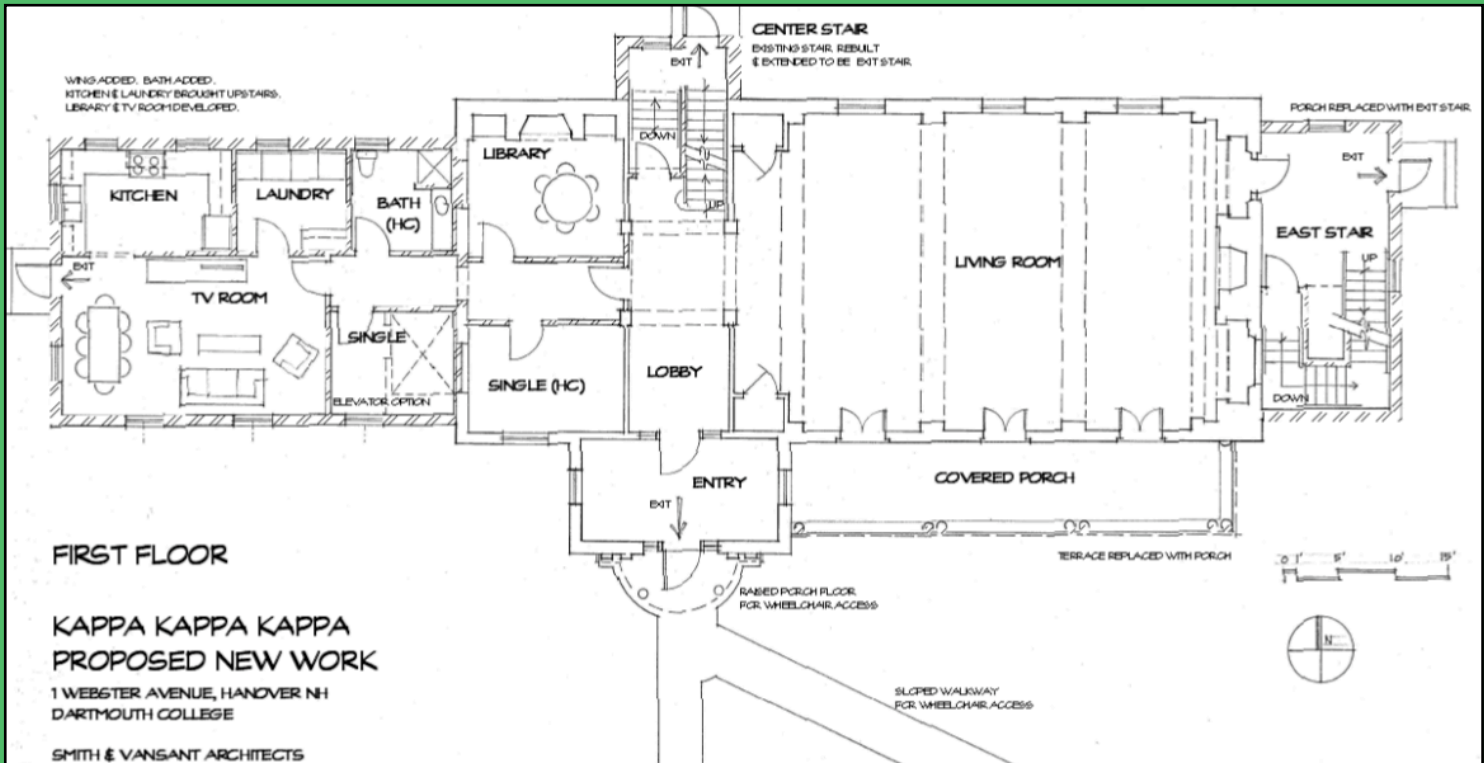
In order to remain an autonomous, local fraternity, Kappa Kappa Kappa relies on the generosity of her alumni and her members.

Kappa Kappa Kappa remains an important part of the Dartmouth community. The administration consistently recognizes the brotherhood for its stellar contributions to the College.

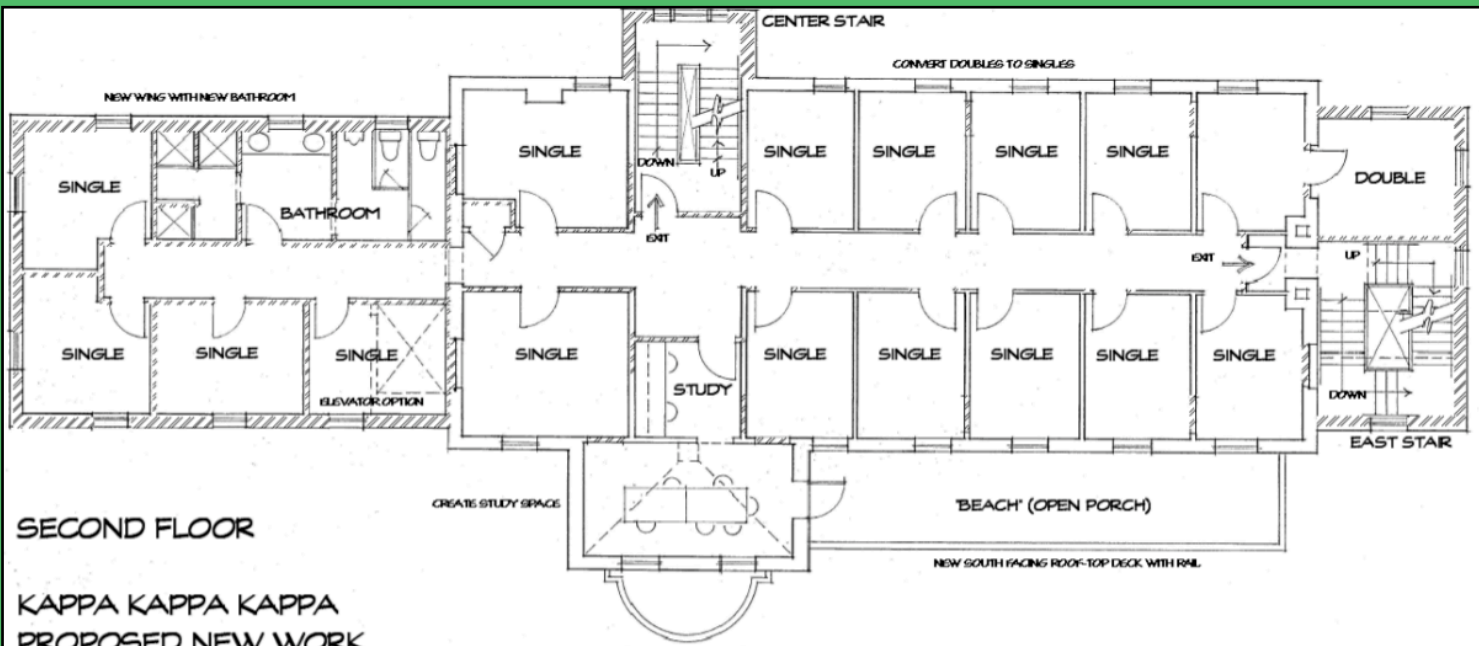




TRI-KAP BUILDING WITH PROPOSED ADDITIONS

Note: Hatched lines indicate new structural additions

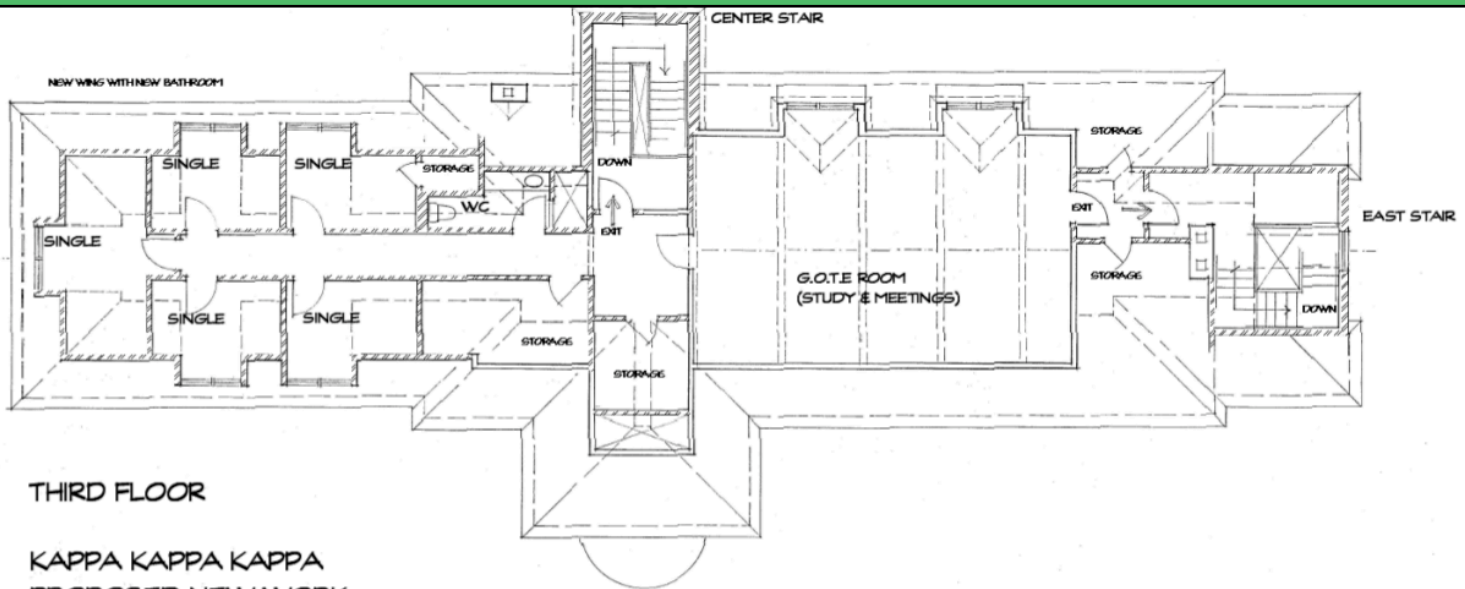


SECOND FLOOR

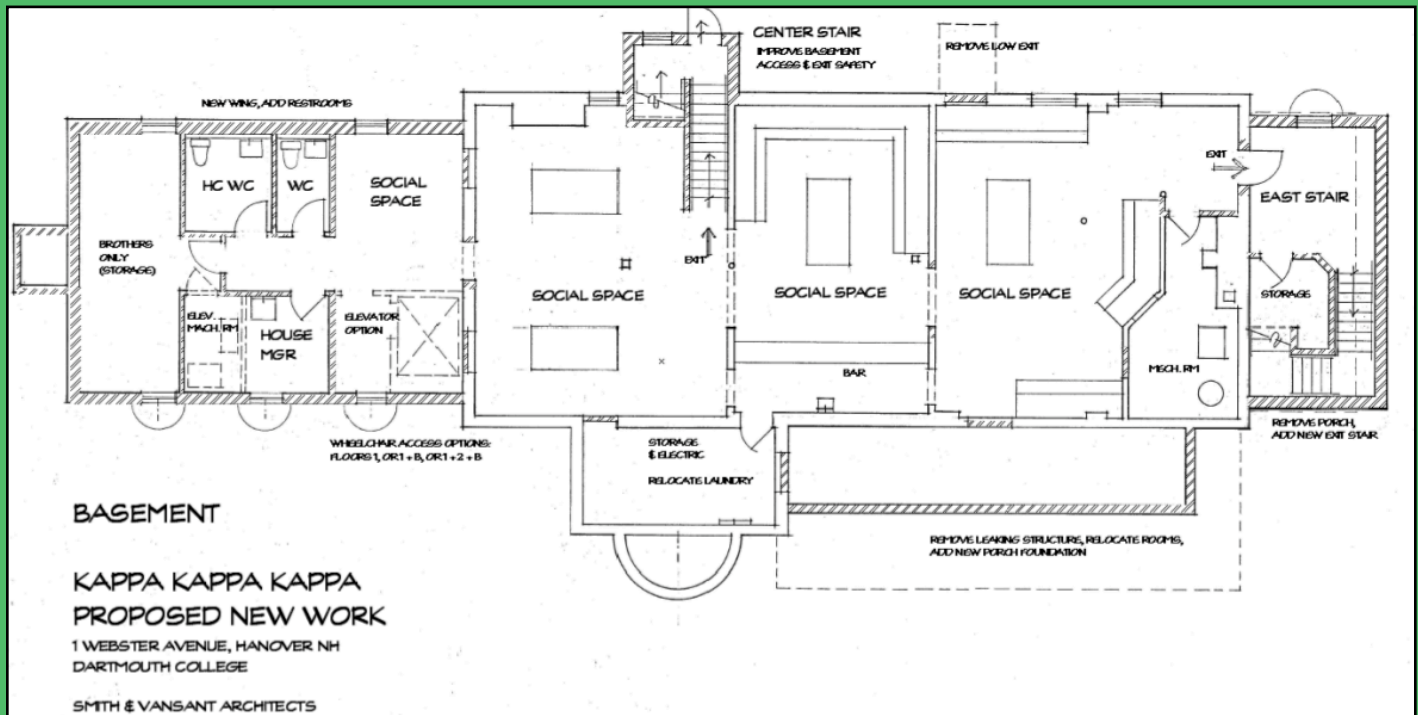
THIRD FLOOR
